 - Response ratio: 17.1% (tentative)


•	Peering Asia 6.0	139 responses from 552 attendees = 25.2%


- Peering Asia 5.0 81 responses from 287 attendees = 28.2%






What is your overall evaluation of the Peering Asia?








How would you rate the registration process?








How would you rate the meeting arrangement tool?








How would you rate the schedule and length of Peering Asia?








How would you rate the venue and facilities?








How would you rate the quality of the refreshments and lunch?













How many days for Peering Asia?




- 2 days (same as Peering Asia 1.0/2.0/3.0/4.0/5.0)

Comments on Peering Asia





Venue

- It would be more convenient to provide a power outlet on each table.(Attendee/AP)
- It would be great if the hotel has enough rooms available and is relatively affordable, so that we can stay at the same hotel where Peering Asia is being held.
 - It would also be useful if there are spaces outside of the presentation sessions or meeting rooms where we can sit and work. (Attendee/AP)
- There were less meeting tables on 1st day morning.(Sponsor/AP)
- Placing the private meeting room closer to the public meeting area would make it easier to use both spaces simultaneously. (Sponsor/AP)





Venue

- A little more sign inside hotel entrance etc to tutorial /venue/Lunch room would be nicer.(Staff/AP)
- The sponsor booth area was a bit hidden but I know this is depending on the lay out of the hotel. I would put the sponsors in the lounge area where possible for the next time. (Sponsor/EU)
- Venue Shangri La was awesome. Nice hotel, good overnight rooms, great facilities, nice place. The rooms on day 2 and day 3 were in a really nice part of the hotel. Day 1 had nothing wrong but day 2 and 3 location was way better.(Sponser/NA)
- As a participant, this one was really good. The cost of the event is increasing and that is very concerning. Accommodation costs (within safe walking or public transport distance) and attendance fees should be kept as low as possible for all economies to attend. (Staf/AP)





Venue

- I felt the location at the back of ROOM B was poor. Ice cream and coffee are available outside.(Attendee/AP)
- There are a ton of meeting spaces, and tables are automatically assigned, which is great. I think the chances of finding a match increase if you have free spaces with no meetings and you can advertise them as open for meetings.(Attendee/AP)





Foods

- Good coffee no long queue. .(Staff/AP)
- Please consider more options for vegetarians. (Sponsor/EU)
- Was nice to have refreshments outside the rooms all day. I was in constant meetings and this was very helpful. This includes coffee, water and all the shacks. thanks for this (Sponsor/NA)





Social

- The social aspect was very exciting, but the food offerings were lacking.(Attendee/AP)
- The social events were too young-oriented. It would have been better if they had more social interaction.(Attendee/AP)
- Music at the social was a bit too loud. (Staff/AP)
- I'd social was less noisy to have the possibility to talk;-)(Attendee/EU)
- The social event was at a pub or disco, and everyone was sitting on the couch because it was difficult to mingle around. The music was too loud to have a proper conversation.(Sponsor/EU)
- The social location was nice but very loud and not enough food.(Sponsor/EU)
- Social Event was too loud, hard to hear and have conversations unless you went outside(Attendee/NA)
- the event much more exiting if the social night is a must. it would create more deep relationship with future partners. It doesn't sound that effective but I think the impact would be huge.(Sponsor/PH)





Meeting tool

- Meeting maker tools should either block off conference slots or at least make it visible when someone tries to book a meeting over the conference slot. (Staff/AP)
- I liked that it was possible to schedule meetings even during the presentations, it puts less pressure on the afternoons like EPF(Attendee/EU)
- Meeting tool Generally its pretty good. The only thing that was confusing is when I need to reschedule a meeting. The tool was not clear on if i need to do something, or if I was waiting on the recipient (Sponsor/NA)
